## 1. Sign-In/Get Your Free Drink Ticket/Welcome/Introductions

The Vice-president Jeanne Duarte led the general meeting. Forty-eight people attended including six non-members. The following board members were in attendance (and introduced themselves); Jeanne Duarte, Chris Marr, Peter McRae, Jane Ledford, Jeff Endicott, Greg Naffz and Tyler Palmer. The attended continued with self-introductions.

### 2. Scholarship Announcement

Jeff Endicott (Education Chair and Mentor) gave a short brief overview of the previous scholarship winner Jeff Ortiz. The \$1000 scholarship for 2015/2016 was announced, applications are due by July 1, and all information is on the chapter's website.

3. A Nevada Ambassador is required to inform the board on what is needed for that state. During the mixer, Marvin Davis volunteered for this position.

#### 4. Overview of 2014

Jeanne presented a brief summary of chapter activities over the past year including highlights of the new goals and the financial report (currently \$47,500 in assets compared to \$58,659 last year). Our income has gone down over the last year primarily due to a decrease in members (404 members currently, 636 in July 2008, 506 in January 2010, 440 members in January 2011) and lack of money making seminars. The members want us to have profitable events that offer a discount to members.

- 5. What Next/Upcoming Activities/Suggestions/Help Requested/Volunteers?

  Jeanne relayed 2 activities are needed for 2015. Based on the survey taken after the drought symposium, the following were reported as the top rated topics.
  - Non-irrigated Native Plant Establishment
  - Post-fire Restoration
  - Restoring Natural Hydrological Processes
  - BMP Basics (How to Install, What to Use, When)
  - NRCS Practices for Water Conservation and Project Case Study
  - Bio-retention
  - CA Landscaping Design Changes
  - Post-construction Techniques/Case Studies

- Drought in Soil and Its' Effects
- Q & A with Regulatory Agencies
- Drought Management and LID
- Water Conservation & Regulations: Adjustment to Meet Drought Changes
- Soil Amendments
- Groundwater Recharge
- Hydro-seeding

The next locations for the Environmental Connections Conference were announced to be in San Antonio, TX in 2016 and 2017 will be in Atlanta. The Chapter was encouraged to put forth a tender for the 2018 conference as they tend to increase the host chapter's membership. Southern California – Long Beach was cited a popular former location. A country border location was suggested for a regional conference, to encourage international attendance.
